In the 1960's an anti-war movement emerged that altered the course of history. This movement didn't take place on college campuses, but in barracks and aircraft carriers, army stockades and navy brigs. It penetrated elite military colleges. And it spread throughout the battlefields of Vietnam.

Hundreds went to prison, thousands into exile. By 1971 it had, in the words of one colonel, infested the entire armed services.
