"View From a Grain of Sand" (2006, 82 mins) is a journey through the last 30 years of Afghanistan's history as lived by three Afghan women. Shot in Pakistan and Afghanistan, a doctor, teacher and social activist tell how war, international interference and the rise of religious fundamentalists have stripped Afghan women of rights and freedom.

Yet through all their loss, the destruction of their homes and country, these women have endured. With courage, conviction and hope they continue to work on improving the lives of the people around them, against all odds, in this brutalized and divided nation.



Meena Nanji has produced and directed numerous works focusing on the global migrations of post-colonial peoples. She has been recognized by the NEA, Rockefeller Foundation and the Paul Robeson Fund. Nanji lectures at universities and conferences worldwide. Her writing appears in the LA Times, UN Daily Journal and others.
